"Your future rests in your courage." That's the motto that 22-year-old Riley Easley lives by. Riley has both autism and anxiety, but neither of those were enough to prevent him from making his dream a reality: Riley is the founder of the small business, Riley Kind. Inspired

by his own passionate commitment to promoting kindness, he specializes in creating personalized greeting cards with the ultimate goal of spreading kindness in the world. Riley was supported by the Building Futures Project for two years at Bridgewater State University through the Massachusetts Inclusive Concurrent Enrollment Program and audited a variety of classes including: acting, design and painting classes. Since leaving BSU Riley has enrolled in Worcester State University and in September will be taking an Introduction to Psychology class. This course fits nicely with his card business and his natural curiosity in understanding people. He also found his dream job working part time at the Worcester State Conference Center.

All Things Possible...that's the name of 24-year-old Jonathan Huggon's photography business. His passion for music and photography has led him to studying music composition and writing 3 songs, performing on stage at Rick's Music World, taking a music class at U Mass Dartmouth and starting his own business. Jonathan has cerebral palsy, communicates partly by using a Tobbii Eye Gaze Communication device, and is dependent upon a wheelchair and personal care assistants. These challenges have not come between him and his plan for achieving his dreams of becoming a successful photographer and composer. Jonathan's work as a photographer has been featured in local newspapers. He has also displayed his work in local galleries. Jonathan sells his photographs at craft fairs, by word of mouth and through his website www.jonathanhuggon.com.

Social inclusion has been one of the most crucial aspects of Tess Keijser's success. For her entire life, Tess, a young woman with Down syndrome, has been in inclusive settings, whether in the classroom or the workforce. As a consultant for Pampered Chef, Tess was twice able to attend the company's annual conference held in Chicago as the recipient of The Nemasket Group's Louis Nisenbaum Memorial Scholarship Fund which paid all her expenses. At the conference, Tess met and spent time with other consultants, learned more about selling the products and received awards for her achievements as a consultant. Now almost 22 years old, Tess is thriving as a Director for Pampered Chef, hosting her own parties and selling over \$20,000 worth of products in the three years she has been with the company. She has done all of this and more while managing Celiac disease, dealing with chronic episodes and flare ups along the way.
